

37 Force who have demonstrated expertise in public or private parking
38 systems; retail or commercial business operation; or interested
39 residents. A balance between residents and businesses impacted
40 should be the goal of membership on the Task Force.

41 City officers and employees and members of other City advisory
42 boards may not serve as members of the Parking Systems Task Force.
43 However, a member of the City's Planning and Zoning Board (P&Z
44 Board) and/or Economic Development Advisory Board could serve as a
45 non-voting member.

46 **SECTION 6:** Duties. The Parking Systems Task Force will assist
47 the City Manager in reviewing the recommendations of the 2011 long-
48 term Flagler Avenue Parking Inventory and Initiatives Report, and
49 the May 2012 UCF parking Management System research project and
50 presenting long-term programs and solutions for the impact of the
51 weekend and holiday beach parking crowd, the impact on adjacent
52 residential areas from the beachside crowds, existing and proposed
53 commercial and retail redevelopment, and providing parking options
54 for special events. This review could include:

- 55 a. The Land Development Regulations regarding parking.
- 56 b. Funding sources to support parking solutions.
- 57 c. Properties for purchase (through ECHO grants when
58 possible) or long-term lease.
- 59 d. Working with the County to "speed-up" beach ingress and
60 egress (review of May 2012 Initiatives).
- 61 e. Exploring the option of a beachside parking structure(s)
62 in addition to surface parking.
- 63 f. Instituting a pilot program to provide remote special
64 event parking and shuttle services at the AOB site, Old
65 High School site and Canal Street. Funding could
66 potentially be provided through a public/private
67 partnership between the City, CRA and/or event sponsors.
- 68 g. Establishing paid visitor parking lots to fund future
69 parking enhancements and beach park maintenance.
- 70 h. Establishing a residents-only parking zone along streets
71 in surrounding neighborhoods.
- 72 i. Review available City or County rights-of-way suitable
73 for parking.

74 **SECTION 7:** The Parking Systems Task Force will meet at least
75 once per month from appointment to November 2012. The Parking
76 Systems Task Force shall elect a chair and a vice-chair. The
77 Parking Systems Task Force shall meet at such times and such places
78 as requested by the City Manager after consultation with the Task
79 Force, as may be necessary to accomplish the Task Force's duties.

80 A majority of the members of the Parking Systems Task Force
81 present at a meeting shall be necessary to make any determination
82 required by the Task Force. Meetings shall be open to the public
83 and minutes shall be kept. A public record of the Task Force's
84 minutes shall be maintained and made available for inspection by
85 the public.

86 **SECTION 8: *Conflicting Resolutions.*** That all resolutions or
87 parts thereof that are in conflict with this resolution are hereby
88 rescinded and repealed.

89 **SECTION 9: *Effective Date.*** That this resolution shall take
90 effect immediately upon its adoption.
