Please see attached email from Utilities Commission GM/CEO Ray Mitchum outlining the key dates regarding the Swoope, Smith Street and SR 44 projects.

Attached is a thank you letter from The Boys & Girls Club of Volusia/Flagler Counties thanking the City of New Smyrna Beach for the sponsorship donation of \$12,000 to assist with programming for the development of boys and girls in our local area.

Please see attached email from City Engineer Kyle Fegley to City Attorney Frank Gummey III regarding petitions for Street Improvements for the 200 block of Ocean Drive as requested by a resident. Input has been received from one individual who is opposed to the paving of the roadway and who believes that all abutting properties should equally share the monetary burden if paving were to move forward.

A road closure notice is attached for a traffic flagging operation at the intersection of Saxon Drive and E. 24th Avenue to accommodate construction of a work site lift station. The flagging operation will begin Monday, November 21, 2016 and continue through Friday, December 30, 2016 between the hours of 8:30 am – 4:00 pm.)

A letter of request from the Artists' Workshop for financial aid is attached. A donation of \$10,000 is being requested to assist with roof repairs due to damage incurred by Hurricane Matthew.

Notes on Post Hurricane Matthew Recovery:

Please see attached update from ACM regarding meetings with FEMA regarding debris removal from private subdivisions. The ACM and Maintenance Operations Director Faith Miller also took the FEMA representatives on a tour of 4-5 sites which were in the discussion. Additional documentation was requested and is being provided after which a report will be submitted by FEMA representatives on behalf of the City.

Attached is photo-documentation of the inventory of Volusia County Hurricane Related Disabled Vehicles located along the IWW in Volusia County as of October 21st. The listing does not include the 10 DV's documented prior to the storm event and previously planned for removal with FWC grant assistance. The Volusia County Coastal Division had begun the process of coordinating removal of those ten at the time the storm hit. Post storm the DV list was updated to include 32 additional boats. Joe Nolin with the VC Coastal Division is working with FEMA and the state to secure additional monies to assist with the additional removals.

The Maintenance Operations Department identified a few additional hurricane related damages to City parks/docks. An updated list as of 11/15/16 is attached as well as a press release regarding miscellaneous dock and ramps closures within the City. The Engineering Department is assisting with securing the environmental permitting necessary to replace sand at the Esther Street location and the 27th Avenue ramp repair will be bid out along with all the dock/marine/fishing pier/boardwalk locations that also in need of hurricane repairs.

Please see attached thank you letter dated October 31st sent to Fire Chief Anglin from Governor Scott for the hard work of first responders; before, during and after Hurricane Matthew.

Frank,

I wanted to bring a situation to your attention that may or may not present an issue with regard to a potential assessment district.

At the request of a resident on the 200 block of Ocean Drive (located between N. Peninsula Ave, & Dune Circle) we recently issued certified mail to ten (10) property owners for feedback whether or not they would approve an assessment to pave the shellrock roadway adjacent to their property (typical ballot is attached).

We approached the assessment in the conventional front footage format, but based on discussion with the CM/ACM it was determined not to assess the properties along the north side of the r/w that had primary access from Villa Way Drive. These properties would realize little if any benefit as they do not have vehicular access to their property from Ocean Drive and in fact there is a 15' utility, landscape buffer & drainage easement platted along the rear of their property to deter access.

The reason I bring this to your attention is we've received input from one individual who is adamantly opposed to paving the roadway (and leads me to believe most residents share his opinion) and furthermore believes all abutting properties should equally share the monetary burden if paving were to move forward.

Although he did not seem like he was going to pursue legal interpretation of the assessment district he did give me the impression if approved his discussions with defining the paving district would continue with Tom Wright, PA.

Let me know if you see any immediate issues with our approach and will discuss this further as ballots are received.

We received your reply to our letter requesting financial aid to the Artists' Workshop Inc.. As I mentioned in our request we are 59 years old this year. During these 59 years we have been an outreach program to the citizens of New Smyrna Beach and surrounding areas. We promote many opportunities to learn create exhibit and appreciate art and would like to continue this very important service to the community.

As of this date the roof has been repaired but we are responsible for 40% of the cost which amounts to \$42k. We have requested our members (250) and general public to contribute and are asking the city to please consider donating 10k towards this effort. As you know we share space at the Marine Discovery Center but are two different entities.

You mentioned in your letter the city has about 4 million in debris cleanup and repairs to city owned facilities due to Hurricane Matthew.

Perhaps the city can commit to donating \$10k at this time with the understanding the funds will not be donated until it receives reimbursements from insurance and FEMA.

In closing we want to thank you and the commission for your consideration in this matter. Please let us know if we can provide any further information or if you need us to appear in front of the commission.



Docks and ramps damaged from Hurricane Matthew closed

City of New Smyrna Beach (November 22, 2016) – In order to assure public safety, damage from Hurricane Matthew has forced closures of three public areas in New Smyrna Beach. Due East fishing dock, the boardwalk handicap ramp at 27th Avenue Park and the handicap ramp at Esther Street Park are all closed until repairs are completed.

Due East fishing pier closed due to damage creating unsafe conditions from Hurricane Matthew. The work needs to be bid out and will remain closed until repairs are complete.

27th Avenue Park handicap ramp leading to the beach has significant damage and is closed for repairs. The park is open and the stairs accessing the beach are available.

Esther Street Park handicap ramp suffered a washout of the sand and is inaccessible. The repairs needed require moving existing sand back into place under the ramp. The City of New Smyrna Beach is working with Volusia County to get a permit to be able to go on the beach to fix it this week.
