City of New Smyrna Beach, FL (May 15, 2017) - The New Smyrna Beach Historic Preservation Commission (HPC) awarded residential and non-residential designations for the 2017 Donnadine Miller Memorial Historic Preservation Awards.

After reviewing the criteria against each residential project, the HPC voted to award the 2017 Donnadine Miller Memorial Historic Preservation Award in the residential category to the owner of 426 South Riverside Drive, Mrs. Kendra Harris.

After reviewing the criteria against each non-residential project, the HPC voted to award the 2017 Donnadine Miller Memorial Historic Preservation Award in the non-residential category to the owner of 103 Faulkner Street, Mrs. Carrie Register.

Candidates are judged upon historic significance, charm and landscaping. Plaques will be presented at the May 23, 2017 City Commission meeting to each of the recipients.

The City created the Historic preservation award program in 2002. In 2009, the award program was renamed in memory of Donnadine Miller, who was an active volunteer and member of the community. Mrs. Miller had served as Chair of the Historic New Smyrna Beach Preservation Commission; worked as an amateur archaeologist; and participated in numerous other events and activities. While award recipients are encouraged to apply for local landmark designation, receiving an award does not place any restrictions on the property.
